



Buenos Aires, Iguazu Falls and Ibera Estuary

The Ibera Estuary is the second largest wetlands in South America and home to several endangered species and over 350 bird species. The region is rich in biodiversity and demonstrates the beauty of a balanced ecosystem. Also in the area is the UNESCO named World Heritage Site of San Ignacio Ruins, a settlement of converted Guarani founded by the Jesuits. This tour will visit Iguazu Falls and Iguazu Falls National Park located on the border of Brazil and Argentina. The National Park is full of exotic subtropical vegetation which surrounds the falls with abundant local flora and fauna. No Argentina trip is complete without a stay in Buenos Aires.

The Ibera Estuary, the largest wetland in Argentina, whose name comes from the Guarani “y bera,” meaning bright water, covers an area of more than 15,000 square kilometers. A unique, pristine landscape full of marshes and savannahs, it is also home to many fascinating species such as two Argentine alligators, the howler monkey, neotropical river otter, the Capybara (the world’s largest rodent) and the Marsh Deer. Situated among the Parana, Paraguay and Uruguay Rivers, the Ibera Estuary provides visitors with an experience unlike most tourist destinations.

We offer a choice of 3, 4, 5-star and deluxe hotels. The Deluxe option is the Alvear Palace or Four Seasons in Buenos Aires and the Sheraton in Iguazu Falls. The Deluxe option in the Ibera Estuary includes a standard room at the 5-star Rincon del Socorro. Please inquire about these options with one of our Travel Consultants

Itinerary

Day 1

Overnight flight to Buenos Aires.

Day 2

Arrive in Buenos Aires, and transfer to your hotel. Afternoon city tour of Buenos Aires, an impressive city that combines the atmosphere of an old European town with the features of a Latin American capital. In this tour, you will acquire a deep understanding of its characteristics, its history, its architecture, its culture and its best stories. We will visit the center of the city, San Telmo, La Boca, Puerto Madero and Palermo, with stops in Plaza de Mayo, Caminito and La Recoleta.

Note: check-in is normally after 2 pm. Early check-in may be granted subject to availability (not confirmed). Also, tour is done on group basis and may involve wait times picking up other passengers at different hotels. We recommend that this tour be done privately in order to avoid this, at an additional cost of \$ 42 per person, based on two people (\$ 84 based on one person).

Day 3

Fiesta Gaucha - Full-day excursion to an estancia for a typical barbeque lunch and a folklore/gaucha show. Here we will learn about the customs of the Argentinean gauchos, and their abilities on horseback that will leave you breathless. The meat will be cooked a la gaucha outdoors on the barbeque. Lunch and drinks included. Afternoon, return to Buenos Aires. Duration: 6 hours. Operates every day except Monday.

Day 4

Day of leisure in Buenos Aires. Evening tango show - At night, you will watch an unforgettable tango show performed by the best dancers and singers while enjoying a delicious meal at Esquina Carlos Gardel. This world-famous tango show features the glamour of the 1930s in a romantic and intimate setting. This is the perfect way to leave Buenos Aires, the city of tango. Three-course dinner and Argentinean wine included.

Day 5

Morning transfer to the airport to take the flight from Buenos Aires to Puerto Iguazu. Transfer directly to Iguazu National Park to view the spectacular Brazilian side of the falls (Visa is required for US and Canadians). Enjoy a guided tour and short walk to take in the full panorama. You will visit the canyon of Devil's Throat, then on to really experience the jungle with a 2 ½ hour adventure of "canopying," an activity in which you will put on a harness and swing through the jungle like tarzan via a network of metal cables. Transfer to hotel on Argentinian side of falls and overnight in Iguazu.

Day 6

Morning, guided tour to the Argentinean side of Iguazu Falls. Pick-up at your hotel and transfer to visitor center inside Iguazu National Park. To get from the visitor center to the beginning of the upper path, lower path and Devil's Throat, you will board a little train that runs from the visitor center to the paths and between them. You may also walk from the visitor center to the upper and lower paths, but not to Devil's Throat because it is more than 4 kilometers from the visitor center. Great Adventure: This tour combines a jungle trip with a boat trip to the falls. Trip

starts in the jungle of the National Park in 4 by 4 trucks without roof for best visibility of the trees and to take good photos. Then we take a zodiac boat to the lower Iguazu River upstream to discover the falls little by little with a panoramic view of the Iguazu Falls. Be prepared to get wet under the falls! Afternoon return to your hotel. Note: this boat tour involves some light trekking and climbing of steep stairs. You need to be in reasonably good shape since it can become somewhat strenuous. Please ask your travel consultant about this.

Day 7

Private transfer with guide to Ibera Estuary. On the way, you will enjoy a visit to the UNESCO-declared World Heritage site of San Ignacio ruins. It is one of the 30 settlements of Guaraní converted by the Jesuits in the late 16th and 17th centuries. Overnight at selected hotel.

Day 8

Choose from a myriad of exciting activities including horseback riding, bird watching, boat trips on the lagoon, spotting wildlife and swimming (activities included in package). Enjoy a lunch and dinner of regional cuisine. Overnight at hotel.

Day 9

Enjoy another day exploring the region and its natural beauty. Again you may choose from the activities offered at your hotel. You will enjoy another lunch and dinner of regional cuisine. Overnight at hotel.

Day 10

Morning transfer to Posadas airport for flight to Buenos Aires. Upon arrival, transfer to the international airport to take your flight back home.

Prices include air transportation from Miami to Buenos Aires, domestic airfare, all transfers, hotel accommodation with daily continental breakfast and full board in Ibera, guided tours in English including all entrance fees. Local airport taxes that are payable in the country of destination are not included. Taxes and security fees that can be paid at time of ticketing are already included in the quote (if airfare has been included in the quote).

No visa is required for travel to Argentina as a U.S., Canadian or Australian citizen. A reciprocity fee must be paid upon entering Argentina. The current amount that must be paid by U.S. citizens is \$140 per person and \$75 per person (single entry) for Canadian citizens.

Note: Yellow fever is recommended (not mandatory) for travelers visiting Iguazu, Manaus and Minas Gerais (Belo Horizonte and Ouro Preto).
